
If your ideas about life after death are undefined but you've accepted that tradition or the greater good of society has great value, there are other possibilities.

# THE BIBLE: A BOOK THAT TRANSFORMS LIVES

During a public debate with a renowned atheist, the Christian asked the following question: "If your car stalled at midnight in the most dangerous section of your city and you saw ten burly guys who had just left the nearby apartment building walking toward you, would you feel relieved to learn that they had just come from a Bible study? The atheist had to answer "yes". The Bible is the only book in history which has changed many lives for the better throughout the centuries; people from a wide variety of occupations, cultures, ethnicities, economic levels and educational backgrounds.

# LETS LOOK AT SOME OF THESE PEOPLE

It was a hot, sultry afternoon in Rome. The year was 386 A.D. A pagan philosopher who was a womanizer caught up in a very sinful lifestyle peered at the open Bible that just happened to be on a bench in the garden in which he found himself. His eyes fell on Romans 13: 13 and 14; "Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about

A young man, full of fear and superstition was caught in a horrific thunderstorm. Terrified, he vowed to become a monk if he survived and so entered a monastery. Although he was continually confessing his sins and doing works of penance, he couldn't get rid of his feelings of guilt. But then the words of Romans 1: 17, "The righteous will live by faith" made him realize that salvation was by grace alone and faith alone. Freed from trying to work his way to heaven, Martin Luther was transformed into a person who at the risk of his life dared to defend the truth of the Bible.

A captain on board a ship bringing slaves from Africa to England feared they wouldn't survive the fierce storm. Afraid he was so sinful God wouldn't save him, he remembered a phrase of a Bible verse he'd heard as a child; God saying, "I stretched out my hand". He cried out to God for mercy and the Lord so transformed John Newton's life that he became a great preacher and hymn writer.

Tatiana Goricheva, a brilliant philosophy student in communist Russia during the 1970's first read something from the Bible, the Lord's prayer, in her

yoga book. After reading it six times, she realized that a personal God existed and that she could have an intimate relationship with Him. She stuck by her new faith even though the risks were great.

Ravi Zacharias came from an influential family in India. As a 17-year-old he attempted suicide. Someone brought a Bible to the hospital instructing his mother to read him John chapter 14. Hearing the message, "Because I live, you also will live" for the first time, Ravi gave his life to Jesus and now travels the world sharing the gospel of new life in Christ.

This is the testimony of a Muslim who can't give his name for fear of reprisal. After he heard the truth about Jesus Christ, he wrote to ask for a Gospel of Luke. Reading it, he learned about Christ's crucifixion – This is denied in the Quran, the holy book of Islam – His great love and His willingness to pardon sin. In 1992, he prayed to receive Jesus as his Lord and Savior. He says; "My goal in life is to consecrate myself totally to Christ who died for me."


Niki Cruz, a gang member who lived to fight and whose prison psychiatrist declared him to be a hopeless case was transformed by the message of the Bible and became a well-known preacher.

A popular singer, living a sinful life was changed by the power of Jesus into a man who spreads the gospel. The Word of God does the same kind of miracles today in the lives of those who take it seriously as it has done in the past.

# THE BIBLE: THE BOOK THAT CHANGES SOCIETIES



More than a hundred years ago there were people in England who declared that "savages" were happy with their way of life and that it was ridiculous to send Christian missionaries to try to change them. However, a skeptic came to the defense of Christianity, writing, "Every person who has traveled to areas inhabited by 'savages' knows that the only places where their lives are safe are those where the missionaries have taught them the Scriptures." That man who had traveled the world was Charles Darwin.

In the book *Peace Child*, by Don Richardson, you can read a fascinating true story. In 1962 the Sawi of Indonesia were both headhunters and cannibals. Because of continual fighting among themselves, they were on the verge of extinction. They most admired the person who could carry out the most clever betrayal by faking friendship before suddenly killing the unsuspecting victim.

Escaping the constantly flying arrows, Don and his wife managed to learn enough of the language to tell them the story of Jesus. Imagine their horror to discover that for the Sawi people Judas Iscariot was the great hero! However, the Richardsons didn't give up and after some time and a lot of patience, a few of the tribe's people accepted Christ. The long-term result was that two-thirds of the Sawi became Christ-followers; now there are no more murders, ex-enemies have become friends, and the population of the Sawi is increasing.

Another example, among many, of the power of the message of the Bible to change entire groups of people is the story of the Waorani of Ecuador. Even in 1950 the Waorani were so fierce that no one could contact them. However, five missionaries decided to attempt to evangelize them.

Nate Saint flew his airplane over their territory dropping gifts. His sister, Rachael, was learning the Waorani language from a girl who had fled from the tribe and was teaching the five-some words and basic phrases. Finally, in 1956, they decided to make personal contact. These five missionaries were killed by the Waorani, and although they

killed the missionaries, the widow of one of the men, along with Rachael, entered the tribe to learn the language and present the gospel to them.

After a time, some members of the group who murdered the missionaries gave their lives to Christ. Today the tribe lives in peace and many are Christians, transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit to such an extent that they have risked their lives in order to share the message of the Bible with their enemies further back in the jungle. Without learning from the Scriptures, they never would have had the opportunity to change their culture.

And the Bible can also change groups of people in industrialized countries as we learn from the book Through the Valley of the Kwai, written by the Englishman, Earnest Gordon. He relates what happened when he, along with many of his fellow soldiers, was a Japanese prisoner of war during World War II. Sequestered in an Asian jungle, they were forced to build a railroad. Because they were forced to complete nearly impossible tasks under cruel supervisors without being given sufficient food, sickness and death were common occurrences. The anger and depression this provoked resulted in a complete breakdown of moral values. In the fight for survival, men were stealing food from their comrades and refusing to help the sick and dying.

But even in this uncaring environment, two men who obviously got their inspiration from their faith in God helped Ernest Gordon when he was in a desperate situation and saved him from cer-

tain death. One day a desperate soldier asked him even to make artificial limbs for amputees. Now to lead a group that wanted to learn more about Christianity. Frankly admitting that he wasn't a believer, he promised to try.

Fortunately, the only information available was from a Bible someone loaned him. Earnest Gordon began to study the life of Jesus from the gospels and to teach what he was learning. More and more soldiers began attending the group. Even hardened military men began putting their faith in Jesus and their lives began to change. It was contagious and transformed the camp. They gathered the available Bibles in order to organize a system allowing a person to borrow a Bible for one hour before returning it to give the next person an opportunity. Many soldiers began to study the Scriptures.

The whole atmosphere of the camp changed. Men began to share what they had learned from the Bible with their comrades, to care for the sick and there was something to say to dying men; words that came from the Bible.

Above all, now, there was hope. The open-air church they started was filled for nightly prayer meetings and other services. They even learned to forgive their enemies. For the first time in what seemed like forever, it was possible to hear singing and even laughter in the camp. The food was still terrible, the treatment inhumane and death a common event but in one year, the camp had been totally transformed by one book, the Holy Bible.

Mass conversions to Christ haven't only transformed the Sawi, the Waorani, the English prisoners of war and the people of Wales (to the extent that in 1904 all the taverns and liquor stores in Wales were closed), but there are historians who believe that the biblical preaching of John Wesley saved England from a bloody revolution, similar to the one in France.

- B. What will you use as the guideline for your thoughts and behavior?
- C. What evidence do you have that this is true? -a pic/photo that looks like the "heavenly city"...
- The Bible is true and you'll live forever in either heaven or hell. Those who have confessed and renounced their sin and have surrendered their lives totally to Christ, the only way to heaven, will go to heaven, BUT,
  - A. How can God send anyone to hell?
  - The person who ignores or rejects God will go to a place where the things which characterize God will be absent – light, love, joy, truth, abundant life – just for starters.
  - Because God knows everything (even though there's not a Bible verse which specifically states this), it's possible that He has arranged that every person willing to accept Christ will have the opportunity to do so.
  - There are many present-day testimonies especially in the Islamic world – of people receiving dreams and visions of Jesus and giving their lives to Him without any Christian present. Certainly this kind of thing could have happened in many places throughout history.
  - God is just. Heaven has to be sinless. No one is able to say that he or she has always

- lived up to the highest standard known for correct behavior. Nobody can declare; "I deserve to go to heaven because I've lived a perfect life."
- God is just because He has given Jesus Christ to be the sacrifice for our sins so we can be cleansed from our sin and made able to go to heaven. We only need to take advantage of this provision.

#### B. How can I be sure of this?

 Jesus Christ not only died (an event which history confirms), but He rose from the dead and appeared to his followers confirming that what he had taught about heaven was true and that some day we'll have bodies like His resurrected one and can live in heaven with Him.

# PROOF FOR THE RESURRECTION

- The empty tomb the body was never found although both the Jews and the Jewish leaders wanted to find it to put a stop to Christianity.
- 2. Explanations for the empty tomb made no sense. "The disciples stole the body while the guards slept", although the guards (16 of them) could be executed if they were caught sleeping on duty, and all the disciples would have had to risk their lives for a lie of saying "Jesus rose from the dead." Or, the women went to the wrong tomb in a high profile case in a very small Old Jerusalem and no one bothered to check out the story of the women.

- 3. The Roman soldiers mistakenly thought He was dead but in spite of His horrific wounds, He revived in the cold tomb – without food, water, or medical aid, and pushed away the two-ton stone and ran around saying he rose from the dead!
- The fact is that the disciples, a real motley crew from the most despised province in the Roman
- Empire, preached (and died for) a message that changed the Roman Empire. Even unbelieving historians say that the disciples firmly believed that Jesus rose from the dead. And an alive Jesus still changes lives today.
- 5. Early Jewish Christians changed their day of worship from Saturday to Sunday in honor of the resurrection.

# WHAT IS THE GREAT MESSAGE OF THE BIBLE THAT CHANGES INDIVIDUALS AND NATIONS?

that it satisfactorily answers the big questions of life in a consistent way that squares with reality, changing the lives of individuals and structures of societies and nations that really believe its message; but it's supernatural in that it really is a collection of 66 books, written by more than 40 authors over a period of 1500 years, and they all contribute to the same basic message. It's possible to capture the central theme of the Bible in one verse; John 3: 16 – "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son that whosoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.

# THE BIBLE IS A COLLECTION OF 66 BOOKS THAT ALL HAVE THE SAME MESSAGE

The Scriptures speak of creation – explaining the nature of the universe and humans, who are all loved by God; the Fall –the entrance of sin with its consequences and punishments that stand in opposition to God's righteousness; and salvation – the Lord, offering salvation by sending Jesus to pay the price so sinners could be free and blessed through faith in the willingness and ability of God to pardon sin, first by means of the sacrifice of animals to cover sin and then by the final sacrifice of Jesus to eradicate sin once and for all for those who accept His mercy and grace, not only for life here but for a fantastic forever with Him.

When a multitude of people asked Jesus the big question; "What must we do to do the works that God requires?" Jesus answered; "The work of God is this; to believe in the one whom He has sent." (John 6: 29) There is a phrase repeated four times in the Bible; "The righteous will live by faith" (Romans 1: 17, Galatians 3: 11, Hebrews 10: 38 and Habakkuk 2: 4) It must be important.

The wonderful message of the Bible gives hope and transforms lives and it is found throughout the Bible in different forms.

# THE MESSAGE OF THE BIBLE

- Just consequences for sin, which is really rebellion against God.
- A Savior, symbolized, promised, present and now in heaven.
- Salvation by faith in the provision of a just and loving God.

## **NOAH AND THE ARK**

He (God) did not spare the ancient world when He brought the flood on its ungodly people, but protected Noah, a preacher of righteousness, and seven others. (2 Peter 2: 5)

- Judgment of a sinful world only after the opportunity to repent was given through Noah's preaching; Everybody knew about the ark and the reason it was being built.
- The ark at that time was God's provision of salvation – it was possible to believe God and enter the ark.
- God provided salvation for Noah and his family because they believed and obeyed God.

# THE BLOOD ON THE DOOR

Each man is to take a lamb for his family... They are to take some of the blood and put it on the sides and tops of the door frames of the houses where they eat the lamb... I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn... The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are; and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. (Exodus 12: 3, 7, 12, 13)

- Judgment on the Egyptians, who after all the miraculous plagues, still rejected God.
- The blood of the lamb on the door (which symbolized the sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb of God, on the cross) was the only way to be saved from the last plague.
- Only those who believed and took advantage of God's provision by putting the blood on the door were saved.

# RAHAB BELIEVES IN GOD

 Joshua 2; Rahab, of Jericho, believed that God would give the land to the Israelites, so she hid the spies of Israel in her house on the city wall and let them down by a rope through a window. They promised her that if she didn't report them to the authorities, and put a red cord in her window, she and her family would be saved when Jericho was destroyed by God.

- The red cord was a symbol for the blood of Jesus, God's only provision for salvation.
- By FAITH Rahab put the red cord in her window and she and her family were saved.

# **JUDGES THAT FREED THE ISRAELITES**

"In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as he saw fit." (Judges 21: 25) Again and again the people strayed from God, suffered the consequences of sin, and finally cried out to God.

- Because the Israelites disobeyed God by worshipping idols, the Lord punished them by invasions from foreign armies.
- God provided godly judges who assumed the role of savior, leading them in defeating their enemies.
- When the people repented and returned to God, the judge, in the role of savior, led them to freedom.

#### THE WORST KING REPENTS

"The Lord spoke to Manasseh and his people, but they paid no attention. So the Lord brought against them the army commanders of Assyria, who took Manasseh prisoner, put a hook in his nose, bound him with bronze shackles and took him to Babylon. In his distress he sought the favor of the Lord his God and humbled himself greatly before the God

of his fathers. So when he prayed to him, the Lord ... listened to his plea; so he brought him back to Jerusalem and to his kingdom." (2 Chronicles 33: 10-13)

- Manasseh was taken prisoner by Assyria, a divine punishment for idolatry and cruelty.
- Returning to God is always the way to salvation.
- Manasseh repented and God in His mercy permitted Manasseh to reign in Jerusalem again.
   He attempted to lead his people back to God.

#### THE PRODIGAL SON

Luke 15: 11-24 — a parable

- An ungrateful and disrespectful son demands his inheritance from his father, goes to a far country, and squanders his money in wild living. He ends up with nothing.
- He finally recognizes that his father (who represents God in this parable) can be his savior.
- Ready to repent and face the consequences of his sin, he returns to his father admitting his guilt and willing to be only his servant. But his father receives him with open arms restoring him to his position as son.

# THE THIEF WHO REPENTED

"One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: 'Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!' But the other criminal rebuked him. 'Don't you fear God?' ... 'We are punished justly, ... but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' Jesus answered him, 'I tell you the truth; today you will be with me in paradise.'" (Luke 23: 39-43)

- The thief on the cross next to Jesus came to the point of admitting his sin.
- He realized that Jesus was the Messiah and the Savior.
- He put all his FAITH in Christ, asking that Jesus remember him when he entered His Kingdom and he was promised: "Today you will be with me in paradise."

# A COMPLETE CHANGE

"Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. ... As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' 'Who are you, Lord?' Saul asked. 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting.'" (Acts 9: 1, 3-5)

- A proud and violent man wants to incarcerate and kill Jesus followers.
- 2. He has an encounter with Jesus, the Savior.
- Saul (later known as Paul) repented, put his faith in Christ as his Savior, surrendering his life to Jesus – and that completely changed history.

# THE PRINCIPAL MESSAGE OF THE BIBLE

All these accounts of redemption and restoration illustrate the main message of the Bible.

- 1. Because Love can't exist without free will (can you imagine a guy pointing a gun at his girl-friend saying, "Marry me or I'll shoot you!"?) God created humans with the possibility of choosing between good and evil. Adam and Eve chose sin, infecting the spiritual DNA of the whole human race. Nobody in his or her own strength can live a perfect life. Everybody has sinned. God is just and sin must be punished. This means we all deserve hell but God "is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but all to come to repentance." (2 Peter 3: 9)
- 2. God resolved this dilemma by sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to earth in human form in order to live the perfect life keeping every commandment God ever gave, and to suffer the punishment of our sin by dying a sacrificial death on the cross so that our salvation would be possible. "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." (2 Corinthians 5: 21) Christ "himself bore our sins in his own body on the tree, so that we might die to sin and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed." (1 Peter 2: 24)
  - 3. But God didn't withdraw free will. He will never force anyone to love Him or have faith in Him. But you and every human can repent of sin and by faith give your life totally to Him and be saved. "Yet to all who received Him, to those who believed in his name, He gave the right to become children of God." (John 1: 12) "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3: 16)

# YOU CAN HAVE UNLIMITED HOPE

Can you imagine having someone on call 24/7 who not only is willing to listen to you and help you, but has the ability to assist you with any problem? Can you fathom a life-coach with perfect information about future events who knows you inside out and plans what happens so that you can receive maximum long-term benefit? Have you ever wished to be assured of a fantastic forever?

This is something available to you and you don't need wealth, talent, right connections, a great quantity of good deeds or the ambition and ability to work hard every day to get it because it's a free gift.

However, you do have to admit that not following God's rules found in the Bible makes every person, including you, a sinner. You do have to give up the right to call your own shots and to center life around your desires and goals. You must trade in getting your own way for following God's way. You need to admit that no self-improvement plan or any effort on your part will make you good enough for heaven.

Before declaring that equal heavenly access is a universal human right, meet Julie, a defiant three-year-old who is elegantly dressed in white to be the flower girl at her uncle's wedding. As her busy mother is getting dressed, she slips outside and plays in the mud that she spreads all over her beautiful dress – even fashioning a "mud hat". Who would accuse her mom of cruelty for giving that little girl the ultimatum: "Either you come in and allow me to clean you up or you stay home from the wedding?"

#### **PHILOSOPHIES**

Philosophies that proclaim that people who haven't had their sins eradicated by the blood of Jesus are ready for heaven forget that they would mess up heaven worse than a totally muddy Julie walking down a white wedding aisle. Sin has ruined planet earth and can't be tolerated in heaven.

The wonderful news is that Jesus suffered the just punishment for your sin and rebellion when He died on the cross. The Bible says, "the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin" and Jesus rose from the dead so He can cleanse us from all wrongdoing. But it's not automatic. It requires turning away from evil and a realization that salvation cannot be earned because it's by grace, the unmerited favor of God. The human part is putting total faith in Jesus, believing that He paid the price to secure your salvation. Then you just talk to Him through prayer asking Him to save you.

Pray a prayer like this one understanding that your heart attitude, not the words, are what is important:

Dear Jesus,

Thank you so much for dying on the cross for my sin I admit that I'm a sinner and can do nothing to save myself. With your help, I turn from evil and I want to obey You from now on. Please forgive my sin and take over my life to make me into the person you created me to be. Thank you for forgiving me and taking control of the throne of my life. Amen
